Felicia Taylor has covered pivotal moments in history including the Gulf War, the stock market crash of 1987, the demise of Long Term Capital Management, the transfer of sovereignty of Hong Kong back to China, the credit crisis, the dot.com boom and the most recent sub-prime mortgage meltdown, amongst many others. Ms. Taylor has provided eyewitness accounts in the field of such disasters as SwissAir Flight 111, American Airlines flight 587, the blackout in 2003 and the UES building explosion in 2006. Ms. Taylor broke the story regarding the extensive abuse of short selling, known as naked shorts in 2004, an incident regarding the manipulation of stocks that is often noted in publications such as *The Wall Street Journal*. Ms. Taylor is a five time Emmy Nominee for her outstanding coverage of breaking news stories including the 9-11 tragedy.



Steven P. Roose, M.D. is Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the College of Physicians & Surgeons, Columbia University and Director of the Neuropsychiatry Research Clinic at the New York State Psychiatric Institute. Dr. Roose did his undergraduate work at Harvard University and attended medical school at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine. After medical internship, Dr. Roose completed his psychiatric residency at Columbia Presbyterian – New York State Psychiatric Institute and subsequently an NIMH-sponsored research fellowship in affective disorders. Dr. Roose's research has focused on the phenomenology, psychobiology and treatment of affective disorders with a specific concentration on the relationship between cardiovascular disease and depression and on the treatment of late-life depression.



Dr. Herbert Kleber is Professor of Psychiatry and Director of the Division on Substance Abuse at Columbia University/NY State Psychiatric Institute. Before founding the Division, he served as Deputy Director for Demand Reduction, Office of National Drug Control Policy, under President George H. Bush. Prior to that he was Professor of Psychiatry at Yale University founding the Substance Abuse Treatment Unit. Currently he oversees research on new medications to treat substance abuse problems. Dr. Kleber is author or co-author of 275 papers, chapters, and books, and co-Editor of the APA Textbook of Substance Abuse Treatment. He has received numerous awards, listed as one of the "Best Doctors in America," and was elected to The Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Science.



Jay McInerney is the author of seven novels, including *Bright Lights, Big City*, his bestselling 1984 debut, which was cited by *Time Magazine* in 2006 as one of nine generation-defining novels of the twentieth century. Translated into more than 20 languages, *Bright Lights* has achieved the status of a contemporary classic. Jay has contributed to numerous publications including *The New Yorker* and *The Guardian* in London. He also has a passion for wine, and until recently, wrote a monthly wine column for Condé Nast *House & Garden*. When he is not writing or imbibing, Jay spends his time as the proud father of two children, Barrett and Maisie, and divides his time between New York and Bridgehampton.
