SPEAKERS



Steven P. Roose, M.D. is Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the College of Physicians & Surgeons, Columbia University and Director of the Neuropsychiatry Research Clinic at the New York State Psychiatric Institute. Dr. Roose did his undergraduate work at Harvard University and attended medical school at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine. After medical internship, Dr. Roose completed his psychiatric residency at Columbia

Presbyterian – New York State Psychiatric Institute and subsequently an NIMH-sponsored research fellowship in affective disorders. Dr. Roose's research has focused on the phenomenology, psychobiology and treatment of affective disorders with a specific concentration on the relationship between cardiovascular disease and depression and on the treatment of late-life depression.



Edward V. Nunes, M.D., Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at Columbia University, is an expert in treatment of patients with substance dependence and co-occurring psychiatric disorders. Following study at University of Connecticut School of Medicine (M.D.), he completed his residency and a research fellowship in clinical psychopharmacology at the New York State Psychiatric Institute. He has authored over 150 book

chapters and articles and currently serves as principal investigator and mentor/consultant on multiple NIH-funded studies that examine treatments for substance dependence and psychiatric disorders. He serves as Vice Chairman of the New York State Psychiatric Institute Institutional Review Board.



Frances Rudnick Levin, M.D., is the Kennedy-Leavy Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at Columbia University and Director of the Addiction Psychiatry Fellowship Program at New York Presbyterian Hospital. Dr. Levin graduated from Cornell University Medical College and completed her psychiatric residency at the New York Hospital-Payne Whitney Clinic. She is the principal investigator on several federally funded grants, a

T32 NIDA funded Substance Abuse Research Fellowship, and collaborates on several other grants. Her research interests include pharmacologic and psychotherapeutic treatment interventions for cocaine and marijuana abuse, and treatment approaches for substance abusers with attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder and other psychiatric illnesses. Dr. Levin has over 125 articles and book chapters and serves on several advisory panels. She is currently the Vice-President of the American Academy of Addiction Psychiatry.
